Safe and convenient My Number Card We will answer your questions and concerns

In Tama City, about one in two citizens has "My Number Card". We would like to address questions and concerns of those who do not have it yet. We would also like to introduce what you can do with your My Number Card to support your life.



What kind of information is contained in My Number Card?

Only the minimum necessary information is recorded

The information contained in the IC chip of the My Number Card is limited to the address, name, date of birth, gender, individual number, and photo of the person on the card.



If my My Number is known to others, will my personal information be leaked or misused by spoofing?

Even if known, it will not be exploited

Even if your My Number is known, your personal information cannot be verified. In addition, the procedure for using the My Number Card requires identity verification by a photo of the face on the front of the My Number Card, so it is not possible to impersonate another person and use the My Number Card to complete the procedure.

Isn't the government collecting and monitoring various personal information?

Information cannot be aggregated and monitored

The My Number system does not have a mechanism to collect and manage your information in one location. The scope of use, collection, and storage of My Number Card are strictly restricted by law. Only administrative staff who accept procedures are permitted to access only the information necessary for the procedures.



I am afraid of carrying the My Number Card. What happens if I lose it?

We take security measures to prevent unauthorized use

When using an IC chip to obtain a certificate, a PIN is required. If you enter the wrong PIN a certain number of times, the function will be locked. In addition, if you try to read information illegally from the IC chip, the IC chip will break. In cases of loss or theft, we accept applications for temporary suspension of card use by calling the toll-free number at 20120-95-0178 (24 hours a day, seven days a week).

You can use the My Number Card in a situation as follows!

Getting certification documents at convenience stores

Various certificates can be obtained at the multi-function copier (kiosk terminal) installed in Convenience Stores (available time = 6:30 am - 11:30 pm). For instance... Copy of certificate of residence, certificate of seal registration, certificate of taxation (tax exemption), certificate of all family register (individual) matters, copy of annex to family register (there is a family register in the city, only the current family register)

Getting Covid 19 Vaccination certificate using an application

From the dedicated app on your smartphone, you can apply, obtain, and display a vaccination certificate (electronic version) of the new Covid 19 vaccination.

Other useful situations!

You can also file a tax return online without going to the tax office by using it as an identity verification document or health insurance card (only at compatible medical institution

●News from the Consumer Consultation Office ※Please be aware! Anxiety-fueling "inspection commercial scheme"

We receive consultation from citizens of cases where a constructor suddenly visit their homes by saying "We are doing construction work nearby, so we will inspect the roof for free". This is a typical inspection fraud scheme. After the inspection, they show photos of broken tiles and threaten that "If you don't react, a severe damage may occur" and try to secure an expensive construction contract. Even if you are told that they will inspect it for free, refuse the constructor who suddenly visit your home and never let them enter your home. In a malicious case, the roof may be destroyed. Also, please be aware that in recent cases, there are companies that use the name of a real construction industry association. Even if you have already signed the contract, you can cool it off within 8 days, as it is considered as "a door-to-door sale". Please consult with the Consumer Affairs Center.
