## Ocertificates can be obtained at convenience stores, and transfer notifications can be submitted through Mynaportal!

Obtaining various certificates Copies of resident records, seal registration certificates, family register extracts (★), and copies of family register appendixes (★) can be obtained from the multi-copy machines at convenience stores. Note: Certificates marked with ★ can only be obtained from current family registers of Japanese nationals whose permanent domicile is in Tama City. ID:1001746.

Moving outside the city (within Japan). You can report your move online from Mynaportal. Note: After submitting a notification of change of residence on Mynaportal, you will need to separately submit a notification of change of address at the counter of the municipality you are moving to.

Are you taking measures to protect your life by making your furniture equipped with earth quake safe? In the 2020 Noto Peninsula Earthquake, people were injured due to overturning furniture and falling objects. They may fall on evacuation routes or around entrances, blocking evacuation routes and hindering evacuation. In addition, falling or falling onto furniture such as stoves can cause secondary damage such as fires. Furniture tipping measures are measures to prevent furniture, etc. from tipping over, falling, or moving. Methods include fixing with L-shaped brackets or tension rods, and arranging furniture safely so that it does

not obstruct evacuation routes. In order to view disasters as "personal problems" and reduce the human damage caused by indoor damage during earthquakes, learn about the necessity and methods of countermeasures against furniture tipping, and learn how to prevent furniture tipping to protect yourself and your loved ones. #### Three measures

- 1. Centralized storage ···By centralizing storage in closets and fixed storage furniture, Try to keep furniture out of your living space as much as possible. (Figure 1)
- 2. Improve the layout of furniture...In the bedroom, as much as possible Please do not leave furniture there.


If you do, please review the layout and orientation. (Figure 2)
