# ● AIR CONDITIONER PURCHASE SUBSIDIES TO BE GRANTED TO HOUSEHOLDS EXEMPT FROM RESIDENCE TAX OR SUBJECT TO PER CAPITA TAXATION ONLY FOR FY 2025

This subsidy program is intended for households that, due to financial reasons, either do not have an air conditioner at home or only have one manufactured before 2010.

- ♦Subsidy limit (estimate): Maximum is 100,000 yen per household (only one application 1 unit per household)
- \$\Delta Subsidy amount: The "actual amount paid" or "subsidy limit" whichever turned out to be lower
- ♦ Eligible costs: Air conditioner purchase, delivery, installation and removal costs (including recycling fees, etc.)
